COVID and Beyond

- ➤ Importance of health and health systems
- ➤ Changes to national and global contexts
- Strategies for health development cooperation need to adapt to the changed context

An Interconnected World

- Developments in transportation sector facilitated spread of the virus and mutations
- ➤ Developments in information systems made rapid diffusion of information on the virus and counter-measures possible
- ➤ Developments in social media influenced popular understandings of the pandemic

Continuing investment in infrastructure will intensify inter-connectedness

Mixed nature of global health

- Sustainable Development Goals state the international consensus that many aspects of health services should be regarded as **public goods**
- ➤ The health sector accounts for around 10 percent of global GDP and there is competition for shares of present and future **markets**
- There is increased concern about access to essential drugs and vaccines as an element of national resilience

Competition for health-related markets

- Lower cost of drugs and diagnostic equipment especially in low- and middle-income countries
- Mechanisms are needed to ensure quality and effectiveness (responsibility of exporting and importing countries)
- > Desire of importing countries to build national and regional production

Development of strategic technologies

- ➤ Major investments by several countries to develop leading technologies in lifesciences (vaccines, drugs, diagnostics, digital health, artificial intelligence)
- Competition for global leadership in markets of the future
- ➤ Demands by other countries to build their capacity for research and development of new health technologies
- ➤ Create new international partnerships in these strategic sectors
- ➤ Measures to foster trust and begin development of global norms and standards

National resilience

- Effective strategies to address disease outbreaks and resistance to antibiotics needs participation by countries at all levels of development
- ➤ Measures are needed to build trust and agree rules essential to support effective responses to future crises
- ➤ It will be important to share information and build scientific collaboration on the management of infectious disease

Sustaining basic health services

- ➤ Adequate funding of basic services in all countries is essential to global health (including in contexts of debt renegotiation)
- ▶It is important to coordinate support for health system strengthening

Building Global Health Governance

- Create opportunities for exchanges of ideas between technical experts (from countries of all levels of development) to identify priority areas for future cooperation
- ➤ Test new partnerships for health development in single countries, regions and/or focusing on key development challenges
- Ensure systematic learning from these experiences and create opportunities for mutual learning
- ➤ Use the lessons from these experiences in negotiating norms and standards
